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Update Aug. 4: COVID Cases and Deaths Among People with Disabilities and Older Adults in Wisconsin

(Madison) – The Survival Coalition of more than 20 disability organizations supports the work of the Wisconsin Department of Health Services and the Governor Evers’ administration to share regularly updated data regarding the impacts of COVID-19 in Wisconsin’s Medicaid Adult Home and Community-Based Services system. People with disabilities and older adults, particularly those who live in congregate or group settings are particularly vulnerable to the virus. Wisconsin’s long-term care program enrollment is 78,206 or approximately 1.4% of the WI population but accounts for more than 1/6 of all state COVID-19 deaths.

Survival Coalition is sharing the Department’s updated data Monthly.

Participants in Wisconsin’s waiver programs, typically referred to as Family Care and IRIS, comprise 15% of the state’s total deaths.

According to DHS data, 26.5% of cases in the waiver system result in hospitalization and 10.8% result in death, compared to 5.3% and 1.2% in the general state population, respectively.
